OVERVIEW

The Associate of Environmental Science provides students with the general education courses normally taken in the first two years at a four-year college or university and a flexible plan from which the student can choose a variety of introductory science courses as part of an interdisciplinary or environmental science program. To receive an Associate of Science in Environmental Science degree, students must: (a) make a minimum grade of C in all required math and science courses and (b) have an overall Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 or greater.
